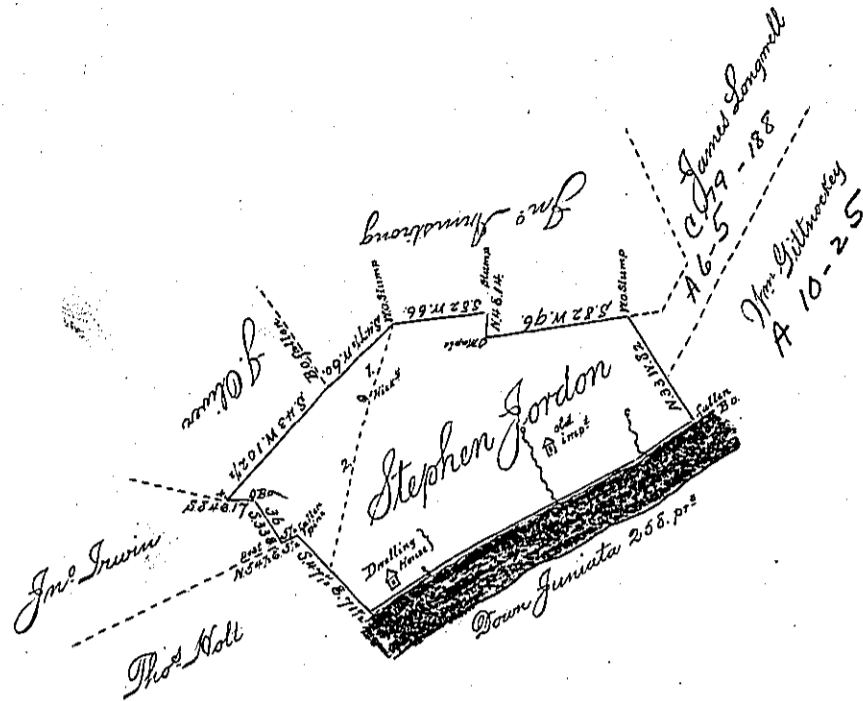


A.P. To be restored of the Dotted line is Claim'd by Samuel Martin

Draught of a tract of Land situate on the north side of Juniata River Dewey Township (formerly Cumberland) now Mifflin County containing Two Hundred & seven acres & 88 perches and the allowance of Six p^{ts} cent for Roads &c. Survey'd the 10th day of October 1801 - In pursuance of an application Granted to Stephen Jordan the 2^d August 1766 - N^o 672 - W^m Harris D.S.

Notes - The dotted lines on the above draught represent lines said to have been formerly run for Stephen Jordan agreeable to a Need Poll from David Woge Esq^r High Sheriff for Cumberland County to William Lyon Esquire sold as the property of Stephen Jordan bearing date the 28th day of January 1769 and Recorded February 14th 1769 - Given under the hand & the Seal of said Office at Carlisle January 23rd 1802.
