W. by y^e sth Brown's Land 72 Perches to a Nickerby's corner, thence South by Mary Graham's Land 51 Perches to a Post her corner, thence North 85° East by her Land & Samuel Davison's Mary Land patent Land 131 Perches to a Nickerby standing in Davison's Line, thence N. 14° W. by his Land 18 Perches to a Post his corner, thence N. Survey'd to Samuel Davison y^e 12th of the 4th moth 1745 a Tract of Land; Beginning at a White Oak being also y^e Begin^g of his Maryland patent Tract thence by Vacant Land S 46° East 35¹/₂ to a White Oak, & E N. E. 21¹/₂ to a post standing in Emmanuel Grubb's Line, thence by his Land N. N. W. 17 1/2 Perches to a White Oak standing in Thos. Jacob's Line, thence N. S. W. by his Land 10 1/2 Perches to a Post John Gibson's corner, thence South 14° East by his Land & Davison's Mary Land Patent Land 142 Perches to y^e Place of Beginning; Containing 22¹/₂ 16 Perches & the usual allowance of 6¹/₂ p^s Ct. for Roads &c
