



In pursuance of a Warrant of Resurvey granted to the Rev: Mr. Smith, Doct: John Redman, Capt. Nathaniel Falconer & Jno: Palmer, bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April, 1773 for the Resurveying of the Liberty Land appurtenant to the Original purchase of Capt: John Martham and Jno: Tyzack, lately in the possession of Wm: Palmer the Elder. These may Certifie that I did on the 5<sup>th</sup> of the same Month Resurvey the said Tract according to its ancient Metes & Bounds and found it to Contain 140<sup>ac</sup>: 123 p. Containing within the said Bounds the quantity of twenty nine Acres of Overpluss. And at the same time I did Survey the part or Share of said large Tract now claimed & in possession of Captain Falconer & found it to contain 71<sup>ac</sup>: 113 p. in which is included sixteen Acres of said Overpluss. And the said Falconer having two Liberty Rights one of Eight Acres appurtenant to the Original purchase of 500<sup>ac</sup> made by Tho: Zachary as by W<sup>ch</sup> dated the 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>o</sup> Mo. 1721 granted to James Steel, for the same may appear, the other for Eight Acres appurtenant to the Orig<sup>l</sup> purchase of 500<sup>ac</sup> made by Joseph Richards, as by Warrant granted to Wm: Palmer dated the 16<sup>th</sup> March 1733/4 will appear, which Rights are now vested in the said Falconer & he requested I would lay the same on the overpluss contained within his s<sup>d</sup> 71<sup>ac</sup>: 113 p. These may Certifie that I have laid the said two Warrants for Liberty Land on the said Overpluss as included in the said 71<sup>ac</sup>: 113 p. of Land. Returned into the Secretarys Office the 13<sup>th</sup> of July last for said Falconer.
