A Draft of a tract of land situate on the north side of the South West Branch of the Raysdown branch of Juniatta in Napier township Bedford County containing two hundred and Eleven Acres and one hundred and four perches and allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed for Daniel Ellis the 19th day of November 1806 on order N° 368 dated the 1st day of August 1766.

N° 1 represented by the dark, colored lines one green line and part of the dotted lines of James Taylor is a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Henry Trigs on Warrant dated the 28th day of May 1766. This tract interferes Fifty Two acres with the Daniel Ellis survey. Henry Trigs conveyed to Samuel Wallace who conveyed to George Woods who conveyed to Lewis Turner the present owner.

N° 2 represented by one Black and dotted lines is a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for James Taylor on Warrant dated the 9th day of February 1813. This tract interferes Sixty Eight acres and one Hundred and thirty five perches with the Daniel Ellis Survey. James Taylor is the present owner.

N° 3 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Matthew Taylor on Warrant dated the 5th day of July 1811. This tract interferes Eighty Acres and one Hundred and sixty four perches with the Daniel Ellis Survey. Matthew Taylor conveyed to George Woods whose Executors conveyed to James Taylor the present owner. The green lines represent part of a Draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Robert Thompson on Warrant dated the 7th day of July 1762. This tract interferes Seventy nine acres and Ninety two perches with the Daniel Ellis Survey. Robert Thompson conveyed to Daniel Clark and William Peters. Daniel Clark conveyed to the firm of Milford & Roberts and Keate and Pegew. The heirs of Milford & Roberts claim part of said tract. Keate & Pegew conveyed to William Keate whose heirs now claim part of said tract. William Peters conveyed to Dr. William Smith whose heirs now claim part of the tract.
