Notes

Beginning at a Chestnut near Tionesta Creek. Thence by line of land warranted to ^{St. Tabmagi} now G. G. Sickles East 53 rods to a White Oak. Thence by said G. G. Sickles line North 30° East 32.5 rods to an Ash. Thence by said Sickles line North 50° East 78.5 rods to a White Oak stump. Thence North 42° East 37.5 to a post & stones on rock the same being the corner of this tract & also cor. of Tracts Nos. 3692 & 3691. Thence by warrant No. 3691 the West line thereof S. 28° E. 130 rods to Tionesta Creek to a hickory by White Oak on bank of said Creek. Thence down said Creek by the following courses and distances South 53° West 22.5 rods. South 40° West 17 rods. Thence South 35° West 35 rods to a Maple. Thence by land warranted to Thompson & Kingsley North 78° West 15.6 rods to an Ironwood. Thence by said land last mentioned North 28° West 31 rods to the place of beginning. Containing 104 acres & 47 perches of land with usual allowance of 6 per cent.
