The said Thomas and John Little hath sold their Right in the One Hundred acres of Land Granted them by Warrant with their Improvement to y<sup>e</sup> sd Robert Turner for 80<sup>ls</sup> Ten Pounds Paid in hand 30<sup>s</sup> to be paid next fall 8<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> fall following. At y<sup>e</sup> Survey of the above Land John Little being Present Argued y<sup>e</sup> Turner Should take but 100<sup>ac</sup> and all y<sup>e</sup> Improvement w<sup>t</sup> without them Lines Shou'd Remain to him & his Brother. But that seems Unreasonable. For Turner hath An Article of their Bargain Signed and alter a Manner Sealed by the said The & Jno Little Binding themselves in the Penal Sum of 300<sup>ls</sup> that y<sup>e</sup> sd Turner Shall be in Peaceable Possession of all their Improvements.

Turner Proposes to get a Patent Directly for y<sup>e</sup> above Land and to take out another Warrant to Include y<sup>e</sup> Field left out on y<sup>e</sup> North side. The time of Settlement I know not but y<sup>e</sup> Improvement are Inconsiderable & Merely Land Patented I shou'd not Value it at half what Turner Pays for y<sup>e</sup> Improvement. But his Design Is to Build a Mill and Advance its Value by help of y<sup>e</sup> Water.
