Survey or cause to be surveyed to Peter Reves Mariner & Joseph Saunders Merchant both of the City of Philadelphia eight Acres of Liberty Land appurtenant to the Original Purchase of five hundred Acres made by Robert Jones deceased & likewise the Quantity of two hundred & sixty four Acres the remainder due to the said Robert Jones whose Right is now vested in the said Reves & Saunders - in any part of the said Province not appropriated & purchased of the Indians

Survey six Acres in Right of Peter Reves in any Part of the Province & make Return of Survey for John Mott thereof into the Surveyor General's Office as soon as possible

To John Lukens Surveyor General of the Province of Pennsylvania Pursuant to the above Order I have Surveyed unto John Mott six Acres of Land - it being an Island in Delaware River opposite Lower Makefield Township Bucks County - between the Plantations of James Moon Junr in Pennsylvania & Ezekiel & Asher Homel in New Jersey - which said six Acres according to the Survey & Draught thereof hereto annexed is included in the Meets & Bounds following viz. Beginning on the Shoal or Sand Bar below the said Island Thence along by the North East (or Jersey) side thereof N 54 1/2 W 120 Perches thence along the upper End thereof S 26 1/2 E 33 1/2 Perches Thence by the South East (or Pennsylvania) side of the said Island S 64 1/2 E 92 Perches to the Place of Beginning (Including the whole Island & a Thoroughfare running through the same) Containing six Acres Strict Measure & is distant from the Pennsylvania shore (according to my Observations made thereon) forty three Perches & from the Jersey - sixty nine Perches & a half Survey'd the first day of November 1783 by
