



In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 11th day of November A. D. 1790, granted to Jacob Bushy, and an order of the Board of Property dated the 28th day of May A. D. 1832, and a Special Commission from the Surveyor General dated the same day last mentioned, being first qualified according to Law, I have resurveyed for the Heirs of Samuel Metherill Dec^d on the thirteenth day of August A. D. 1832, the above described tract of land, situated in Schuylkill Township, Schuylkill County, formerly Brunswick Township, Berks County, containing two hundred twenty one & an half acres, and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. I found the survey well marked, and the lines and corners as stated in the above draft. — The marked trees counting forty one or forty two years —
