



A Draught of Three Tracts of Land. Now divided into Four. Situate in Maccory Township in the County of Northampton in the State of Pennsylvania. That were formerly Surveyed to Adam Broufs Senior Containing together Three hundred and Fifty one acres and 36 perches of Land. with the usual allowance at 6 per Cent for Roads. That were Surveyed to him by Three particular Warrants who by his Deed Poll Dated the 28 February 1773 conveyed the equal half Part of the whole (Being 175^{ac} 98 Perches at allowance to his son Adam Broufs Junior. and also the other half Part to his son George Broufs etc to Adam Broufs 108^{ac} 45 p etc and 67^{ac} 53 p etc and to George Broufs 127^{ac} 50 p etc and 48^{ac} 48 p etc. Surveyed and Divided for them on the 15th and 16th November 1774 and now drawn again) since some of their Draughts are mislaid or Lost. on the 19th August Anno 1782.
