W.B. by the Information which I received there Nath Ben cleared on said Island by Estimation about one half acre for about 14 or 15 year ago. Put Know Grain never Rased there.  
 It is the same Island which I surveyed for Wm Robert Buttz on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of April 1840 by Virtue of a warrant granted to said Buttz dated the 9<sup>th</sup> day of March 1840 and Give the Draught to the said Buttz on the 21 February 1842. to Return in the Surveyor Generals Office, and stated in said Draught that at the Time of Survey, John Traxel claimed the Island, and said he had a Deed for the same. I also Was Proved on by Wm Buttz to Survey and Make return of the first Survey as he Contended that Know Title ever had been Issued for the Island.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this
