



The above is a representation of three tracts of land interfering with each other Situate on the waters of Robinson run in Robinson township Washington County. — The black lines embrace a tract of land called Gilberton Surveyed to Gilbert Mc Adams March 9th 1790, in pursuance of a Warrant Granted to said Gilbert Mc Adams for 350^{as} dated Feb^y 11th 1790. Gooseberry Thicket embraced by the red lines, is a tract of land Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Beavers dated December 5th 1788 for which a Patent issued to John Mc Donald the 13th October A.D. 1804 for 376^{as} 52^{ps} & allowance. — Blackberry Plains embraced by the blue lines is a tract of land Surveyed to Richard Willis on a Virginia entry for which a warrant of acceptance issued to David Kennedy the 17th March 1790 to whom a Patent was granted the 23rd March 1790 for 400^{as} Strict measure. — Gilbert Mc Adams' Survey contains in the whole 302^{as} 132^{ps} allowance of six p^{ts} 6^{ts} but by a decision in the Court of Common Pleas of Washington County (their titles being at issue) 219^{as} 01^{ps} & allowance of six p^{ts} 6^{ts} was cut off by the two surveys above described, leaving the compartment marked B containing Eighty three Acres one hundred and thirty one perches and allowance of six p^{ts} 6^{ts} to Gilbert Mc Adams clear of dispute, and remains unpatented. Surveyed for Gilbert Mc Adams the 6th day of November 1825.
