



A Draught of three hundred & ninety nine acres and 119 perches of land with six perches for Roads situate in Anasaght township in Mifflin county surveyed 29th May 1812 in pursuance of a Warrant to James Miller dated 16th December 1811. Notes: Kavanah's house or large Cabin with a family of five or six persons living in it, his weaver shop his garden and more than an acre of cleared land under fence in a state of cultivation. In running the line N. 42 5/8 E. Paul Single claimed the vacant land then North and West of me, and claimed a hearing at the Board of Property of his rights. In running the line S. 63 1/2 W. William S. Ellison claimed it to run on to include to the dotted line which was included in his Original survey but was left out by a late Surveyor as surplus land. In running the line S. 43 1/2 W. from a tick, Joseph Kyle claimed all the vacant adjoining land then North and West of me by virtue of his improvement which when the above Survey was made, consisted of his Cabin 12 log high, clapboard roof, stone chimney, well, furnished with household goods and a woman and several children in it; with about half an acre of land cleared under fence and some grain growing in it Jo^s Kyle's 1/2 acre field
