



The above is a Draught of a Survey made July 6th 1827 for Alexander Murdoch Situate in the fork
of Charlies Creek in Strabane Township, W. C. Containing four hundred acres and 76 perches and
allowance of six per cent. The above embraced by the black lines and the Creek is the same that was lately par-
titioned and set apart to George Morgan Esq; out of a body of lands called Morganza. It is also composed of
part of three original surveys. The Compartment marked A Contains $319\frac{1}{4}$ acres being a part of a tract of
land granted to William Preston in pursuance of an App^r No. 517, dated April 3^d 1769. Containing
 $37\frac{1}{4}$ acres, on the West side of the Monongahela River. The Compartment marked C Contains 311 acres,
being a part of a Tract of land granted to Robert Garrison, in pursuance of an App^r No. 548, dated April
3^d 1769. Containing 27.3 acres and 117 perches, on the west side of the Monongahela River. The Compartment
marked B Contains $70\frac{3}{4}$ acres, being a part of a tract of land granted to David Evans in pursuance
of an App^r No. 1969, dated April 3^d 1769. Containing 201 acres, and 116 perches on the west side of the
Monongahela River. Note, the parts are Strict measure.
