



In pursuance of two Warrants granted to Henry Davis, the above represented tract of land was Surveyed to the same at sundry times, containing two hundred and eighty four acres fifty eight perches and the allowance of six P. G. Situate in Plum Creek Township, Armstrong County bounded by Crooked creek, the original survey of Robert Cogley (now lands of Pitt and Galham, George Kellrich and heirs of \_\_\_\_\_) lands of Adam Wilhelm Joseph Hutchinson, William Fiseus, lands of the latter and said Henry Davis and lands of the heirs of George Shoemaker deceased. The western part containing one hundred and seven acres, one hundred and seventeen perches it was first Surveyed some time in March A.D. 1830 in pursuance of the warrant of the 13<sup>th</sup> of Jan<sup>st</sup> 1830 and the eastern part was Surveyed on the 9<sup>th</sup> of Jan<sup>st</sup> 1833 in pursuance of the warrant of the 10<sup>th</sup> of Dec<sup>th</sup> 1832 and contains one hundred and seventy six acres one hundred and one perches and the allowance of six P. G. each, and the yellow colored dotted lines of the diagram represents an imaginary divisional line of the two parts of the same farm.
