Called N<sup>o</sup> 2 Both Surveyed for the heirs of William Plumstead Dec<sup>d</sup> and directed to be confirmed to them by Patent per order of the Honourable Board of Property dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1793 Resurveyed and laid off the above parts for the executors of John Brown Dec<sup>d</sup> the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1826.
