



In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the 28th day of February 1759 granted to William Jones and Edward Croston for six hundred Acres of Marsh Swamp and Cripple Situate in the Township of Moyamensing in the County of Philadelphia Particularly therein mentioned, I did in the Latter End of April and Beginning of May in the said year by Order of Nicholas Scull Surveyor General, Survey all the Marsh Swamp and Cripple in said Warrant mentioned Computed to Contain about 600^a and did then return the whole Vacancy to said Nicholas Scull who returned such part thereof for said Jones and Croston as they then agreed to pay for and on a Resurvey made this 19th day of April 1768 I find the Cripple and flats to be much the same as I then surveyed them and as said Scull did not then return them I do now return them for the use of the Hon^{ble} the Proprietaries in order to agree with said Jones and Croston for the same agreeable to their Contract Containing Fifty four Acres.
