In pursuance of a Warrant of Survey, dated the Twenty third day of May A. D. 1837 and to me directed, authorizing and requiring me to survey unto Amos Corson of the Township of Oxford County of Philadelphia Fifty acres of unimproved Land adjoining Lands late of Elias Toy dec^d on the South East, other land of the said applicant on the North Pennepack creek on the North East, and low-water mark of the Delaware River on the South East and wholly unimproved. Situate in Lower Dublin Township, in the County of Philadelphia aforesaid. I have surveyed the same and make return of the same as follows:- To Wit:-

Beginning at a Stone set for a Corner of the Lands of the said applicant Amos Corson and of the said Elias Toy dec^d thence extend- by the line dividing said Lands continued South Thirty two and a half Degrees East Sixty eight Perches and Sixty-five Hundredths of a Perch, or thereabout to low-water mark on the Delaware River, thence along the same by the several courses of the low-water mark thereof (the general bearing being about Fifty four and a half Degrees East Two Hundred and Twenty-seven perches more or less to a Corner at the mouth of the Pennepack creek thence along said Creek North Eighty-six Degrees West, Thirty-four perches and Seventy-five Hundredths or thereabout to a corner on the last Land of said Amos Corson, thence by the said Amos Corson's Land the Three following courses and distances To- Wit:- South Sixty Degrees West one hundred and thirty four perches and six tenths of a perch. North Twenty-five Degrees West Thirty perches and South Fifty-eight Degrees and Thirty minutes West Sixty-three perches to the place of Beginning, Containing Fifty Acres Two quarters and Thirty-six perches more or less. The following is a protracted Figure of the above described premises.
