



In pursuance of a Marcant dated the second day of September A.D. 1850, surveyed the 5th day of September A.D. 1850 unto George T. Saltham the above mentioned tract of land, being an island, flat or sand bar, now bare at low water, and formerly part of Mind Well Island in the River Delaware in the County of Philadelphia which lies opposite to the District of Southwark and nearly south of the southernmost part of a survey made the 14th day of August 1849, unto said George T. Saltham in pursuance of a Marcant dated the 4th day of the same month and patented to him on the 22nd day of August 1849 (see Patent Book 36, Vol 47 page 248) Beginning at low water at the southerly point of said island thence extending along low water mark of the River Delaware the following courses and Distances to wit. S. 58° 05' E. 6.4 Perches. S. 17° 38' E. 15.89 Perches. S. 68° 45' E. 13.4 Perches. S. 21° 57' E. 18.11 Perches. S. 9° 41' E. 14.8 Perches. S. 77° 14' W. 6.62 Perches. N. 24° 00' W. 15.67 Perches. N. 14° 18' W. 15.21 Perches. N. 8° 53' W. 13.41 Perches. N. 3° 05' W. 15.68 Perches and N. 49° 34' E. 7.21 Perches to the place of Beginning, Containing four Acres and One hundred and eighteen perches
