



A Draught of a tract or piece of Land, Situate in Cedrus Township in the County of York, containing as above set forth 85 1/2 by 137 Perches & allowance & Co. part of 192 1/2 & allowance & Co. which was originally surveyed on the 8th of the 4th month 1767, by W^m Hothers late D.D. in pursuance of two applications No. 2340 & 2345 the one for 200^{ac} and the other for 150^{ac} granted to Michael Newman, bearing date the 14th day of January 1767. Since divided to two on the 7th day of September A.D. 1837, examined & corrected the above & Co. at the request of Jacob Epmeyer, the present owner, who requested me to make return of the same for confirmation. To W. D. I further state that the heirs of Jacob Hoyer, deceased, claim the small triangle above within the Red lines, containing 52 perches & allowance & Co. in pursuance of a survey made on the 15th day of May A.D. 1811, under a Warrant granted to George Hoyer, for 119^{ac} bearing date the 20th day of March A.D. 1811. All of which I nevertheless submitted to the Surveyor General
