The other dotted lines represent part of the Draught of a tract of land Surveyed for John Gibson on Warrant dated the 15th. day of September 1762 - This tract interferes three Hundred and Seventy four acres and Thirty Six perches, with the Jacob Harlin Survey - John Gibson conveyed to John Gessna, who conveyed to Jonathan Gessna who also purchased from Jacob Harlin and conveyed the same to Richard Delapt who devised the same to John Williams the present owners.
