



To Hon. John Laporte

Surveyor General of Pennsylvania:

In pursuance of your Warrant of 25 August 1845, to me directed, I have surveyed to John Lyon, William Brisbane, and Jacob B. Lyon, the tract of land therein described, and hereby make return of the same as follows - viz:

Beginning at a post, Thence along lands of Charles C. Burnham, North one degree East, one hundred and nine and 5 tenth perches, to a post; East twelve perches to a post; North one and a half degrees West, one hundred and twenty five and 4 tenth perches to a stone pile; Thence along lands of Jesse Love and John Fisher (not mentioned in the Warrant) West one hundred and one perches to a stone pile; Thence along lands of Solomon Miller (not Christian) South one and a half degrees West, one hundred and Sixty-four perches to a post; West one hundred and three perches to a post; Thence along lands of Dennis Shorthill, (not mentioned in the Warrant,) South one and a half degrees West, Seventy-one perches to a post; Thence along lands of Robert Allison, East two hundred perches to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and eighty-two Acres and Seventy Perches and allowance, including an improvement made in March 1814.

A Draft or plot of the same is hereunto annexed.
