

Situate in the River Susquehana, Caled "High Rock" in the Township of Canastogoe and County of Lancaster. Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrent for one and a half Acre_Granted to John Kindig and Philip Urban dated the 10th day of November 1803 the Courses and distances are as follows Viz! Beginning at a stone where this to Mark is Plaseed in the above diagram, Extending thence down the River South twenty one degrees East twenty perches 4 four tenth. North Sixty nine degrees East twelve perches 4 five tenth, North twenty one degrees West twenty perches 4 four tenth and South Sixty nine degrees West twelve perches 4 five tenth to the Place of Beginning Containing one acre and a half and the usual Allowance being about forty yards below Cripel Island and about two Hundred and fifty yards below an Island improved by George 4 Lewis Urban and Israel Nestelroth and about one Hundred 4 Sixty perches from Lancaster Shore Nov! 15th 1803 pr.
