



Situate in the River Susquehanna, Caled "High Rock" ^{Island} in the Township of Canastota and County of Lancaster. Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrent for one and a half Acre. Granted to John Kindig and Philip Urban dated the 10th day of November 1803 the Courses and distances are as follows Viz: Beginning at a stone where this ~~is~~ Mark is Placed in the above diagram, Extending thence down the River South twenty one degrees East twenty perches & four tenth. North Sixty nine degrees East twelve perches & five tenth, North twenty one degrees West twenty perches & four tenth, and South Sixty nine degrees West twelve perches & five tenth to the Place of Beginning Containing one acre and a half and the usual Allowance being about forty yards below Cripel Island and about two Hundred and fifty yards below an Island improved by George & Lewis Urban and Israel Nestelroth and about one Hundred & sixty perches from Lancaster Shore Nov^r 15th 1803 pr.
