N.B. the heirs of Henry Horst dec. claim the above described land as being contained in their Survey of 1749 on a warrant to Jacob Regre & that the line of marked trees is not their partition line but the dotted line marked ~~BT~~ to be their boundary. George Kaylor insists that his survey of 1797 by warrant to David Campbell dated 28<sup>th</sup> May 1748 runs by the blacked line bearing N 51 3/4 W. or by the line of marked trees bearing S 48 E.
