In pursuance of an Order of the Honorable the Board of Property bearing Date the first Day of Decem-
 ber 1788, Survey'd the above Tract or Parcel of Land Situate in Letterkenny Township in the County of Franklin
 Containing in the whole four hundred and thirteen Acres and 104 Perches and an Allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.
 for Roads & c^a possessed and claimed by the Widow and Heirs of William Sharp deceased, Part of which
 disputed by John Neely & others, — but as I have not been furnished with the Grant refered to in the Order,
 nor any Copy thereof, cannot report whether or not it is for the Land in question — Am told, however, that
 Testimony will be addressed to the Board respecting that Matter — Am also inform'd that a Patent has been ob-
 tained by William Sharp for that Part of the above Land lying Northwestward, extending, as is supposed
 down to the red Line, containing, by the Resurvey now made, 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ Acres & Allowance, and that the other
 Part, forming an oblong Figure, adjoining John Finley containing 162^a 2⁴ $\frac{1}{2}$ A. & Allowance, is the Part
 disputed by Neely & Others. — As the Draft of the patented Part may doubtless be found in the Surveyor
 General's Office, a Copy thereof obtained (with which I have not been furnish'd) will distinguish with
 precision between the patented and un-patented Parts of this Land. Survey'd Febr: 13th 1789.
