The Red lines Show the first and Original Survey made for George Webbs. W^t dated 4 March, 1750 which appears to have been made in 1752. but in the year 1774. on the 6. April George Webbs wa^t was again surv^d according to the yellow lines. & returned. on the 13. Jun. 1774. confirmed by a Patent. - at that time. the blue Survey had been made. in 1755. as appears by the line trees. the green Survey was made on a W^t to Lewis Herring. dated the 4. November. 1790. the improvement on the Blue Surv^y. consists of only some clear land. commenced about 40. years ago -- there is an old improvement on it. but when that was commenced, I can not ascertain. - the original Survey was made for James Scull. in right of Ellis Hughes.
