



John Morris Says he holds 163^{2/3} & 140^{2/3} - Under Martham Purchase of 513^{2/3}. - The Secretary Orders that there be an Allowance of 10^{2/3} Ct. on his 163 acres & 140^{2/3} and that the Remainder be Returned with an Allowance of Six^{2/3} Ct. which makes the Overplus 165^{2/3} & 107^{2/3} and allowance aforesaid.

At the Request of Jr.^o Morris I have Carefully Resurveyed the Tract of Land whereon he now Dwells (Situate in the Township of Whitmarsh in the County of Philadelphia) being Part of a Tract Originally Granted to William Martham for 513^{2/3} which Part (being Bounded & Limited as above Described) I find to Contain Three Hundred and Fifty five Acres & 140 Perches of Land without any allowance, so that there appears to be 153 Acres ~~2/3~~ & allowance of 6^{2/3} Cent. of overplus Land within the Lines of the same, which the said John Morris Desires to Cover by ^{2/3} Warrant Granted to him the 11th Day of April 1767, "for the Surveying & Laying out the Remaining Part ~~2/3~~ Unlocated of 362 Acres Supposed to be 242 Acres," which Warrant is accordingly Located on the said 153 Acres and allowance of Overplus Land, in part of the said 242 Acres.
