



The Diagram ^{in blue} represents a tract of Land in Tyrone township Perry County Originally Surveyed in pursuance of a warrant dated the 30th of Nov^r 1766 for 100^{ac} Granted to John Johnston and Contains 113^{ac} 105^{ps} and Allowance and now Resurveyed for Richard Parkinson the present possessor, 22nd May 1822 The adjoining Survey in pop^d lines was also Surveyed to the said John Johnston in pursuance of warrant dated the 6 Nov^r 1771 for 120 acres which is now also Resurveyed and return^d in two separate returns, a part for the said Peter Hench, and a part for said John Carl, containing together 147^{ac} 124^{ps} and allowance. But

Note. It appears the said warrants were both executed at once without any division between them; embracing 237^{ac} 35^{ps} together; that afterwards Adam Junkins and Benjamin Junkins holders under Johnston, made the above division line between themselves, which appears as consistent with said warrants both with respect to bounds, and quantity as any other that could have been made, to wit placing the 1st Warrant of the 30 Nov^r 1766 for 100^{ac} South of the run; and 2nd Warr^t of 6 Nov^r 1771 for 120 adjoining
