



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Williams Township Northampton County, the Dotted Lines Represents one of the Tracts Returned to George Palmer late Deputy by the late Surveyor General, agreeable to an act passed the 26th March 1820, Directing the Recovery of Money Due the Commonwealth from Persons holding Lands under the Proprietary Government. Original Surveyed to Michael Keough by Warrant of the 16th March 1742, for 148^{1/2} acres and the allowance of 6 p.c. &c.

By Virtue of the above Mentioned Warrant, Surveyed the 13th day of February 1840, to Jacob Bond in Right of the above named Michael Keough the aforesaid Tract of Land, Containing Twenty acres one hundred and two perches and the allowance of 6 p.c. &c Being part of the above Mentioned Tract.

To B. By the Information which I have Received the Root of the Land is Clear, and hath been improved upwards of _____ years, a good House and Barn is erected thereon, and Jacob Bond and his family soon Residing thereon.
