



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Williams Township Northampton County, the Dotted Lines Represents one of the Tracts & Returned to George Palmer late Deputy, by the late Surveyor General, agreeable to an act passed the 26 March 1820, Directing the Recovery of the Money Due the Commonwealth from Persons holding Land under the Proprietary Government. Original Surveyed to Michael Kough by Warrant of the 16 March 1747 for 140⁰ 113⁴ and the allowance of 6 p. C. & c.

By Virtue of the above Mentioned Warrant, Surveyed the 14th December 1822 by George Palmer late Deputy, to George Hooser, in Right of the above named Michael Kough, the above Described Tract of Land containing nine acres twenty one perches and the allowance of 6 p. C. & c. and by sundry lawful Conveyance, the said Tract of nine acres twenty one perches, became vested in the Right and Possession of Jacob Best. Examined and approved February the 24th 1840, at the Request and for the use of the said Jacob Best
