



A Draught of a Tract of Land, situate in Haverford Township in the County of Berks [formerly Philadelphia] in the State of Pennsylvania containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and 40 Perches of Land, and the usual allowance of six per Cent for Roads that was formerly surveyed & surveyed by Edward Deull to Henry Loar by Warrant granted him by the Late Proprietaries Dated on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>r</sup> Anno 1733. The said Henry Loar on the 21<sup>st</sup> January 1735 Paid £ 15. 10 sh. in Part for the same into the Receiver Generals Office, and died intestate Anno 1738. Then afterwards all his Messuages and Land, containing above two hundred acres, was sold and conveyed, by the other heirs of the said deceased, to his two sons Philip Loar and George Loar [al. Loar or Law] as by their Agreement or Deed Roll Dated the 21<sup>st</sup> February Anno 1759 will appear. The said Land was resurveyed on the 25<sup>th</sup> January 1760. The whole is now intended to be conveyed by Patent to the said oldest son Philip Loar [al. Loar] and drawn for him on the 30<sup>th</sup> March Anno 1790.
