



A Draught of a Tract of Land, Situate in Berks Township in the County of Berks [formerly Philadelphia] in the State of Pennsylvania, Containing Fifty Two Acres and No Tercies of Land and the usual allowance at six per cent for Roads, that was formerly Surveyed, Supposed by Edward Sull to Henry Loar. By warrant granted to him by the Late Proprietaries dated on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October anno 1752. And after the said Henry Loar's Death the above Tract together with his other Land, was by the other heirs of the said deceased sold and Conveyed to his two sons Philip Loar and George Loar [al. Loar or Lauer] by Agreement of February 21<sup>st</sup> anno 1759, and resurveyed to them, on the 2<sup>d</sup> January anno 1760.
