



A Draught of a Tract of Land, Situate in Haverford Township in the County of Berks [formerly Philadelphia] in the State of Pennsylvania, containing Fifty Two Acres and 110 Perches of Land and the usual allowance at six per Cent. for Roads, that was formerly surveyed, supposed by Edward Bull to Henry Loar by Warrant granted to him by the Late Proprietaries dated on the 12th day of October Anno 1757. And after the said Henry Loar's Death the above Tract together with his other Land, was by the other heirs of the said deceased sold and Conveyed to his two sons Philip Cahrs and George Cahrs [al. Loar or Lawr.] by Agreement of February 21st Anno 1759 and resurveyed to them, on the 25th January Anno 1760. Now drawn for Philip Cahrs [or Loar.] on the 30th March 1790.
