Note - A survey was made, by virtue of the above named Warrant to Samuel Weiler, by John Dreher for S. Landerbrum Esq. D.D. on the 3rd day of December A.D. 1828, but return of the same does not appear ever to have been made. At the instance of Reuben Weiler, one of the heirs of Jacob Weiler dec'd it appears that Daniel P. Weaver Esq. late D.D. made a survey, by virtue of the aforesaid Warrant, on the 6th day of May A.D. 1846, and made return of the same.

It also appears that Samuel Weiler declares, that he is the sole owner of said warrant, and has continued to be ever since the date of the same up to this time. And that Reuben Weiler had no authority whatever, from him the said Samuel, to have a survey or return made on the above mentioned warrant; and that hereupon he has, by his Agent Charles Weiler, entered his caveat in the Surveyor General's Office, against the acceptance of said return made by the late Dep. Surveyor. There are no improvements on the above land.
