



Situate in Chanceford Township York County surveyed the 5<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> Mo. 1773 for William Doherty in right of Charles Charva in pursuance of a Warrant for 100 Dated the 13<sup>th</sup> of September 1750 To B. this Land had been run round with the rest of Cha<sup>r</sup> Charvas Land and Cha<sup>r</sup> Doh<sup>r</sup>s 196<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> and allow off this end to James Dickson but never got it laid off together with a Mart right for 100 and Dickson sold to Doherty & others & now at the request of the parties its laid off for Doherty
