



A Draught of three tracts of Land, situate in Northborough Township in the County of Philadelphia and Province of Pennsylvania, late Belonging to Elias Long Senior deceased. But the whole is now to be conveyed By all his other Heirs unto his youngest Son John Jacob Long -

The first tract Containing One Hundred and Fifty acres and the usual Allowance for Roads was surveyed by Virtue of two Warrants the one Dated on the 30<sup>th</sup> Octob<sup>r</sup> 1734. The other dated on the 6<sup>th</sup> Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1734 - and was surveyed by Nichol<sup>s</sup> Dull on the 4<sup>th</sup> April Anno 1735 -

The second Containing Thirty acres and 11 Per and the Allowance surveyed by Warrant of the 17<sup>th</sup> May Anno 1741 -

The third Containing Fifty acres and 23 Per and the allowance surveyed by Warrant of the 12<sup>th</sup> July 1749. -

The whole Containing Two Hundred and Thirty acres and 34 Perches of Land, together with the usual allowance of six per Cent for Roads and was Resurveyed for the said John Jacob Long on the 26<sup>th</sup> February Anno 1771. -
