



A Draught of (abt) Tract of Land Situate in (abt) Milford Township in the County of Northampton, and Province of Pennsylvania. — — — Being Part of a Tract of (abt) Acres, etc. or Part of One Hundred Acres. Taken up by George Shoemaker. The Said Fifty Acres Thereof did afterwards belong to his Son Adam Shoemaker but lately belonging to Peter Miller, who now Sold the above Tract thereof to John Nicholas Hayn — and kept the Remainder for himself.

Beginning (abt) a white Oak Sapling, a Corner of Michael Wolfgang Juniors Land. Thence (abt) the Same, and by Land of Late John Knowse, now Peter Martin, North East 65 perches to a Stone; a Corner of Jacob Sloughs Land. Thence by the Same and by Land of John Nichol Miller South East 79 perches and 2 Tenths of a Perch to a Stone, a Corner of the said Peter Millers Land. thence by the Same South West 65 perches to a Stone in the (abt) of Jacob van Buss Kirks Land. Thence by the Same, and by Land (abt) Michael Wolfgang Junior, North West 79 1/10 perches to the Place of Beginning — Containing Thirty Acres of Land together with the (usual) Allowance at Six per Cent for Roads.
