Being part of a larger tract of 232^{ac} and allowance which was Originally Surveyed by Thomas Cookson late D.S. on the 1st day of May 1744, in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Francis Fincher bearing date the 12th day of January 1743. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tract the 28th day of November 1820, at the instance and request of John Cline & Henry Ensmenger the present owners. —
