In Pursuance of the Application No 3087 for 200<sup>a</sup> Granted to William Willson bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March - A.D<sup>o</sup> 1767 Resurveyed by the old lines on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of December 1814. at the request of the owner Alexander Frazier & who desired the same to be returned for Confirmation — N. B. the part marked W, up to the dotted line Interferes with a survey made by George Stevenson late D.S. by warrant Granted to Thomas Sharp dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of March 1755. Returned &c. But there appears to be a Marked line Corresponding with the Claim of Fraizer in right of William Willson and none as represented (obl.) Sharps Survey. Alexander Fraizer and those under whom he claims having a Cleared field on the above mentioned Land near to where the letter W is placed. and am Informed that they have had it in quiet and Peaceable possession for nearly 30 Years. In Consquence whereof it has been included within the bounds of the resurvey as made on the Application of William Willson above mentioned. All which is nevertheless submitted to the Surveyor General. —
