By Virtue of the above Mentioned Warrant, Surveyed the 5th day of March 1851, to Peter Gross Administrator of his Father Philip Gross Dec^d in trust for the Heirs of the Said Philip Gross Dec^d in Right of the Said John Riechner, the above Described tract of land No 1 Containning three acres and sixteen perches and the allowance of 6 p C &c.

The Dotted lines of No 2 Represents the whole tract originally Surveyed to John Frantz, by Warrant of the 26th day of October 1774, Containning 73^a 93p and the allowance of 6 p C &c. By Virtue of the above Mentioned Warrant, Surveyed March the 5th 1851, to Peter Gross, Administrator of his Father Philip Gross, Dec^d in trust for the Heirs of the said Philip Gross Dec^d in Right of the said John Frantz, the above Described tract of land No 2 Containning three acres and sixty perches and the allowance of 6 p C. &c.
