



Situate in Dover Township in the County of York, containing as above set forth One hundred and thirty one Acres, twenty two perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of 287^{ac} 61^{per} & allowance. Originally surveyed by George Stevenson late D.S. on the 13th day of April 1753 in pursuance of two Warrants; One for 100^{ac} granted to Leonard Flower, dated the 26th day of April 1750, the Other for 100^{ac} granted to George Schlegner, dated the 24th day of September 1751— The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract on the 12th day of December 1809— And now at the request of William Trimmer the present owner of said part, the Draught is examined, corrected, calculated and returned for Confirmation April 5th 1822—
