



Agreeable to the Directions of the Surveyor General on an Order of the Board of Property granted <sup>1796</sup> ~~to the request of the~~ ~~oblig~~ of James Crawford Dated 1<sup>st</sup> April 1796 — on the 21<sup>st</sup> June 1796 assisted by said Crawford and other Heirs of Samuel Smith in the said Memorial named — I resurveyed the above Tract of Land in Antrim Township (late in Cumberland) now in Franklin County Containing four hundred and thirty seven Acres 18 Perches and Allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent &c. — said by the Claimants to have been first officially surveyed by Zachariah Butcher, of which survey there has been no Draft or Plott shewn that would fit on or lie within the said lines, or any how correspond with the waters therein and their courses. — But the said Tract appears to have been Surveyed by William Lyon for John Armstrong Esquire D.S. and by him called a resurvey Dated October 15<sup>th</sup> 1759 for John Hingry in right of John Scott in pursuance of the Proprietaries Warrant bearing Date the 13<sup>th</sup> August 1746 & which survey is directed to John Lukens Esq. S.G. — That part Containing 53 Acres 63 Perches and Allowance, and lying North West of the red line is said to be claimed by Henry Sniveley, & to be within his Patent, and for which a Suit at Law is now pending — And a Warrant granted to Samuel Smith, Dated 19<sup>th</sup> May 1796 — for 50 Acres has been lately put into my hands, by said Smith which he says is for land in the Southermost Corner of the above Survey.
