



Situate in Rush Township, Schuylkill County, containing 40<sup>1/2</sup> 10<sup>2/3</sup> & Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads, being a part of the Survey of a larger tract of land of Isaac Stauffer and Allowance, which was Surveyed on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of July, A.D. 1829 by George Reber Esqr. the Deputy Surveyor, and by him recorded in his Official Draught Book now in my possession, by Virtue of a Warrant granted to Henry Stauffer dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1829. (but by him entered, as being on a Warrant of June 22<sup>d</sup> 1829.) — By a recent investigation it appears that the above Survey is covered by a Warrant in the name of George Ashton, of the 10. July 1793 all excepting the above 40<sup>1/2</sup> 10<sup>2/3</sup> & allowance. Resurveyed on the 20 November A.D. 1839
