



Situated in the Pigeon Hills Berwick Township Adams County ~~Surveyed by me~~ being part of a larger tract of 87° 53' P. & all. Surveyed December 19th 1805 in pursuance of a Warrant to Christopher Slagle for 50^{ac}. Dated July 28th 1750, which had been surveyed by Francis M^c Cullouch, about the year 1753, and afterwards surveyed by Charles Lukens D.S. neither of which are to be found in the Surveyor Generals office, the part marked A was surveyed April 14th 1774 by Arch^d M^c Clean D.S. with other land on a warrant to Philip Bader & Adam Hubert, Dated 10th June 1762, who probably did ^{not} know of M^c Cullouchs & Lukens Survey, the triangle B also belongs to Bernard Allewalt assignee of Philip Bader, although it is not included in Baders survey and I believe no other person has any claim to it, from information which I had from one of the grand sons of Christopher Slagle it appears that Bader purchased what Allewalt claims from the heirs of Christopher Slagle, but got no conveyance for it, which was also the case with Barlinger & Null who purchased a part of the same land the above 8^{ac} 155^P Surveyed & Divided from the residue the 19th December 1805
