



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Hereford Township in the County of Berks in the State of Pennsylvania Being Part of a Tract of 159^{ac} 70 perches et allowance which by a Vacating Warrant dated the 3^d August Anno 1744 was Surveyed to George Suller and after it went through Several Hands the Same by Deed Poll of the 17th November 1772 was sold by John Miller to George Marsteller and after his Death the above Part was sold and is now to be conveyed to his Son in Law Henry Rauch either by the other Heirs or by the deceased^s Executors ~ ~ Beginning at a Stone in the Line of Philip Rauch^s Land thence by the same and by Land of Leonard Griesmer and Peter Aston South 41^{deg} West 107 perches to a Stone, thence by another Tract of the said Aston^s Land North 50^{deg} West 88 perches to a stone a corner of John Gregory^s Land, thence by the same North West 110 perches to a Stone, Set for a Corner of Peter Marsteller^s Part of the said whole tract, thence by the same the same, the following Courses and Distances. Viz^t North 70^{deg} 30^{minutes} East 74 perches to a Stone, and South 34^{deg} East 50 perches to a stone and North 75^{deg} East 12 perches to a stone, and South 29^{deg} East 6 perches to a stone, and North 60^{degrees} East 49 perches to a white oak, and South 30^{degrees} East 14 perches and four Tenths to a wild Cherry Tree, and South 30^{degrees} West 22 perches to a stone, and South 44^{degrees} West 26 perches to a stone, and South 84^{degrees} East 86 perches to the Place of Beginning ~ Containing Eighty One Acres and Fifty Perches of Land together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads ~ Surveyed and finished for the Said Henry Rauch on the 23^d May Anno 1788 ~
