The Draught of a Tract of Land Surveyed to Francis Parvin In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the 6th day of June 1738, Situate in Bern Township in Lancaster County, Beginning at a Red Oak by Schuylkill, thence down the same 250 perches to a Post near the upper end of a small stream which forms a small Island, thence crossing the said stream and the Head of the said Island and another small stream South 64 degrees East 15 perches to a Post at the Head of a larger Island, thence down the Easterly side of the said large Island 164 perches to a Post near the lower end of the said Island, thence ~~ob[li]terated~~ crossing the said Island ~~and the said small stream~~ ~~ob[li]terated~~ Black Oak Corner of Land of Nicholas Souder, Thence on the same course by said Souder's Land and Vacant Land in all 339 perches to a Post, thence by Vacant Land North 103 perches to a Post, North fifty six degrees West by the same 83 perches and an half to a Post, thence by the same North 40 degrees East 139 perches to the Beginning Containing 306 acres of Land beside Allowance.
