A Draught of a Survey containing Three thousand and two Ac^s and One hundred & fifty four Poles situate on Raccoon C^k in Washington County, surveyed Sep^r y^e 2^d 1785 for Charles Simms Ass^{ee} of William Douglass in Consequence of a Military warrant granted to s^d Douglass by the State of Virginia, and entered with y^e County Surveyor y^e 30th of May 1780, as appears from the List of Entries transmitted from the Surveyor General's Office; also from the Entry taken from the Surveyor's Books of York^a County of which the following is a copy

Virginia, Surveyor's Office, Yohiogania County, Ss.

- " Charles Symms Ass^{ee} of W^m Douglass produced a warr^t for 5000 Ac^s of Land due said Douglass for Military Service perform^{ed} in y^e late War between Great Britain and France, agreeable to a proclamation of 1763, dated y^e 8th of May 1780 N^o 915 - 900 Ac^s thereof he locates on lands in Montour's Island about 4 Miles below Pittsburg.
- " 1000 Ac^s on Raccoon above Nath^l Kirkendall^s includ^g some Imp^{ts} made by Cap^t Rob^t Bell, and part surveyed by Rob^t Lettice Hooper for Alex^r Ross. - 1000 Ac^s he locates adj^g the above Entry includ^g other Imp^{ts} made by said Bell -
- " 1000 Ac^s he locates adjoining the above includ^g Lands surveyed by Rob^t Lettice Hooper for W^m Dunbar
- " 500 Ac^s he locates on Lands between Crows Island & Rights Run below y^e M^o of Beaver C^k on y^e River Ohio.
- " 600 Ac^s he locates adjoining the above Entry. May y^e 30th 1780. W. Crawford S. Y. C.
- " Entry Book N^o 1, Folio 415, Entry N^o 15. Copy Tested B. Johnston, S. Y. C. Feb^r 20th 1785

As Col: Simms means to insist to have the whole Survey included in one Patent, or three at most, we have indulged him in returning the whole together, but apprehending he may be disappointed in his expectations, we have subdivided it into eight Surveys, seven of which contain each 400 Ac^s 18 P^s and y^e eighth 202 Ac^s 28 P^s Strict Measure.
