



Surveyed the above described tract of land (being unimproved) containing one hundred and sixty four acres, and three tenths of an acre, and the allowance of six per Cent for roads, on the 9th day of May 1856, for Thomas De Courcey in pursuance of a Warrant granted to him on the 22d day of March 1854, for 168 acres of land, - Situate in Union township, Tioga County, Penna.

Note. I believe the above survey to be an interference with Warrt N° 4780, Miller and Murray Warrantees, now belonging to the Lycoming valley Iron Company; my reasons therefore are first: The patent to John Vaughan, for Warrt N° 1612, calls for lands of Miller & Murray on the South; secondly: The official return of survey of Warrt N° 4780, shows the whole of the Roaring branch to be South of the northern boundary line of the last mentioned Warrant; Thirdly: The southern boundary line of the above described survey is only twelve years old. - The Warrantee De Courcey on the other hand asserts that the Lycoming Valley Iron Company in making the resurvey of their lands, have made the southern boundary line of the above described survey their northern boundary line, and did not claim the land North of it, and requested me to make return of this survey into the Surveyor Generals office To J. Porter Brawley Esq S.G.
