 22^d Feb. 1797 on a Warrant granted Robert Bochannon & Moses Williamson for 300 Acres dated 21st May
 1793 & Resurveyed on 6th 7th & 9th Sept 1839 & found to contain as above —

Note I began this survey at the fallen Hick^y, a corner of Comforts Heirs in right of James
 Gemmel on the line of Abm Miller and found old marks up to the stones Corner of Miller and from there no marks
 except marks made by John W. Shaw when he run the Phillip Minehart Tract about 18 Months or 2 years
 before for the heirs of John M^cFadden Decsd. I then run the dotted line and found no marks older than
 those that Shaw had made, which dotted line represents the interference with the Phillip Minehart survey
 so far as to the Stones corner & from the Stones Corner I found no marks down to where I made a tricker
 grub & Stones a corner — and on 5th June 1840 I went again onto the Ground & commenced at the fallen
 Hick^y where I began on 6th Sept 1839 and run the line S 32 E 116 and found no old marks further than Abm
 Millers Corner but continued my course 22 perches above the corner of Phillip Minehart, That being ^{the} distance
 called for on the old draft where it called for a Oak Corner But found no Marks I made diligent search for
 the Oak Corner but found I mad a po corner & run N 60 E upward of 100 perches but found no marks
 & at the instance of D.W. Hulings who appears to be the present owner I have returned this up to the
 Black line & all that part between the dotted line & it is foul of the Phillip Minehart survey & that
 inclosed in they dotted lines adjoining James James Gemmel is returned on a Wt for 50 acres dated
 29th August 1839 Granted Geo Brought — J.S. D.S.
