



A draught of 200 acres of land being part of a larger tract situate in Washington Township Erie County ~~surveyed~~ drawn for John Sherwood from the survey and plot made and entered in the survey book by C. E. Webster — It appears from the survey books kept by my predecessors that the whole tract was first surveyed in 1802, by John Cochran on the settlement & improvement of Charles Woodworth — and that it was surveyed again by virtue of a Warrant to Charles Woodworth on the 25th of Oct. 1806, by Thomas Smith D.S. ^{with alterations.} And also that the tract was resurveyed on the 25th of Oct. 1833 by C. E. Webster in pursuance of an order from the Board of Property, dated 20th Sept. 1833, which last survey contains 428 acres & 87 perches, of which the above draught represents a part to wit 200 acres & allowance — as shewn by a preceding draught on this paper —
